These are four months of homemaking classes we did years ago with our neighbors using 4H project books!



October 31

Gardening: Identifying weeds in our hearts and weeds in our gardens. Begin filling out our project books.

Homemaking/Sewing: Begin Your Room project book. Discuss bedmaking and changing, keeping room tidy and cleaning. Start 12 week room maintenance chart. Make pillowcase.

Cooking: Aileen prepare spaghetti

Cardmaking: Intro to rubber stamping

Materials needed to bring: 1 yard of material for pillowcase.

Homework: Make bed and keep room tidy daily--fill out chart! Care for container plants. Take pictures of you with container plants for project books.

Plan menus using list of ingredients (lunch or dinner).



November 7:

Gardening: Plan spring garden. Make poster for fair on project book.

Homemaking/Sewing: Make dusting mitt for room and oven mitt for cooking.

Cooking: KB and JA prepare lunch

Cardmaking: embossing

Materials needed to bring: Old towel to make dusting mitt and 1/2 yard quilted material for oven mitt.

Homework: Keep room chart. Care for container plants.



NOVEMBER 14:

Gardening: Psalm 1. Report on our container plants.

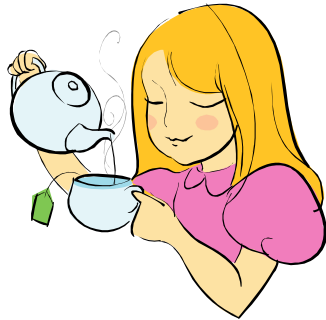
Sewing: Begin apron.

Cooking: Good Morning muffins & banana bread!

Cardmaking: Anything you want!

Materials needed to bring: 2 yards material for apron.

Homework: Keep room chart. Care for container plants.



DECEMBER 5:

Special Mother/Daughter Bible study; making Christmas hair bows and lunch.

Materials to bring: 1/4 yard for each hair bow. Main dish salad.



DECEMBER 17 (TUESDAY!):

Anne of Green Gables Tea Party. Dress as your favorite Anne of Green Gables character or from that time period. (11 a.m. until 1 p.m.)

Lunch and craft!

We hope you enjoyed these “Good Old Days” lesson plans that we used to homeschool our children years ago. They are compliments of Powerline Productions.
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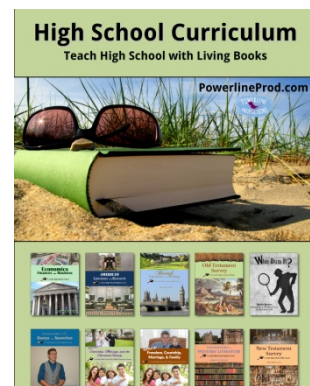
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
