

Worship with our Minds

We worship God with our minds. We show love to Him with our soul, mind, strength and heart. We have to retrain our minds to focus on Him during Praise and Worship in the congregational setting and often in our personal devotional times as well.

Our minds have been taught by our culture to be entertained, so we seek out entertainment. When we feel bored or under-stimulated, our minds wander to other things. It is amazing the depth that our minds can sink to in times of corporate worship. We may be lifting our hands on the outside and lusting in our minds on the inside. A homemaker can be writing up her grocery list for the following morning. A businessman can be finalizing a deal for the upcoming week. Or we may be evaluating the clothing or behavior of those around us. All these things do NOT glorify God and keep us from giving a sacrifice to God as worship.

We start out with thankful thoughts and progress from there. Colossians 3:16 inspires us to sing with gratitude in our hearts to God. There is so much to be thankful for.

We Thank God for All the Blessings He's Given us

Every good and perfect gift comes from Him. We could spend hours making long lists of His blessing in our lives: health, sight, shelter, food, family, friends, chocolate, music, nature, beauty, money, and fun.

The Lord keeps all promises that are given in His Word. His promises are amazing and wonderful.

God gives us financial gifts, vacations and surprises of all sorts.

He even blesses us with trials that require perseverance or spiritual warfare, both of which build godly character in our lives.

God gives us hopes and dreams.

He gives us a church family, pastors and leaders to care for us, brothers and sisters to nurture us, and younger siblings to disciple.

We Thank God for What He's Done for Us

Those prayers that were answered last month are something to thank Him for today! I try to thank God for prayer answers over and over again, just like I pray about things over and over again.

God intervenes in our life regularly: opening doors for us to walk through, giving us favor, or allowing us to be used by Him in exciting ways. How many times have you been healed physically or emotionally by the Lord? Think back to colds, bouts with the flu, broken bones, hurtful words, divisive relationships, or other injuries that God has restored and healed you from.

God meets our financial needs.

He gives us joy for mourning!

He heals our broken hearts and gives us wisdom for life.

How many times has God forgiven you? If you're like me, that's a long list.

God does so much in our lives that we can praise Him for as we enter His courts.

We Thank God for Our Salvation

We get to spend forever with Jesus because of what He has done on the cross. Jesus Christ died so we could live eternally with freedom from sin and despair.

We cannot bypass thankfulness. It is like trying to enter a room without opening a door and banging our head against a wall, trying to create an opening. Thanking God is how we start our time or worship.

Gratitude changes our perspective of God, ourselves, and our circumstances. We enter His Presence knowing that **WE ARE BLESSED** because **HE** has blessed us!

Our Minds Seek to Know Jesus

We think about who He is. As we start thanking God for what He has given to us and done for us, we naturally move toward hungering to really **KNOW** God. We want to know the Giver of the gifts and the Shepherd who has cared for us.

Our hearts and minds wander to Jesus, who He really is. We begin to think of Him by His different names and what they reveal about Him. God is: Redeemer, Shepherd, Savior, Lord, King, Counselor, Creator, Judge, Prince of Peace, and Mighty Warrior.

We think of God's nature, His love, His holiness, and His reign.

Let your mind ponder Jesus. Meditate on who God is. This quiet contemplation allows you to unlock depths of your spirit and releases you to pure worship. This whole process can begin with thinking about who God is.

Our Minds Seek to Know and Understand His Love for Us

His love is immeasurable. Who can understand how wonderful this love is?

Thinking about the love of God is easy. It is so big and so amazing. Our Heavenly Father is lavishing us with love and Our Heavenly Bridegroom is the Perfect Lover. He pursues us with passion and devotion. God's love is tenderhearted and gentle as He holds us in His arms.

He is the perfect Father, delighting in us and urging us to live lives worthy of His Glory! His love is demonstrated by priceless sacrifice, relentless pursuit, and faithful devotion. He is faithful and true, even when we are unstable. His extravagant love is lavished, poured out and freely dispensed on all of us, His beloved children.

When we are in the midst of a unified Body of Believers worshipping God, it is often possible to experience God's love in a deeper way than at any other time. We can even understand His love to its width, height, length, and breadth. It is unexplainable, but you can experience it!

Our Minds Think about the Promises of God

God gives us everything we need to escape corrupt living and experience fruitful lives through His promises. They are blank checks that we can cash in at any time. There is an aspect of praise and worship called "Declaration" where we exalt God by declaring Who God is, who we are in Christ, and His promises to us. His promises are spoken and sung aloud to God, ourselves and one another. This pleases everybody!

Meditating on God's promises can take us to other places in worship. As I think about different promises, I might thank and praise God. As we ruminate on various promises, we might find ourselves understanding God Himself or His love in a new way.

We also can "cash in" God's promises during praise and worship, resulting in breakthrough and freedom. Meditating on God's promises can lead to hearing the voice of God and flowing in the spiritual gifts, often occurring during praise and worship.

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
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
