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DECEMBER 16:



"In the time of Herod king of Judea there was a priest named Zechariah, who belonged to the priestly division of Abijah; his wife Elizabeth was also a descendant of Aaron. Both of them were upright in the sight of God, observing all the Lord's commandments and regulations blamelessly. But they had no children, because Elizabeth was barren; and they were both well along in years.

Once when Zechariah's division was on duty and he was serving as priest before God, he was chosen by lot, according to the custom of the priesthood, to go into the temple of the Lord and burn incense. And when the time for the burning of incense came, all the assembled worshippers were praying outside.

Then an angel of the Lord appeared to him, standing at the right side of the altar of incense. When Zechariah saw him, he was startled and was gripped with fear. But the angel said to him: 'Do not be afraid, Zechariah; your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you are to give him the name John. He will be a joy and delight to you, and many will rejoice because of his birth, for he will be great in the sight of the Lord. He is never to take wine or other fermented drink, and he will be filled with the Holy Spirit even from birth. Many of the people of Israel will he bring back to the Lord their God. And he will go on before the Lord, in the spirit and power of Elijah, to turn the hearts of the fathers to their children and the disobedient to the wisdom of the righteous--to make ready a people prepared for the Lord.'

Zechariah asked the angel `How can I be sure of this? I am an old man and my wife is well along in years.'

The angel answered, 'I am Gabriel. I stand in the presence of God, and I have been sent to speak to you and to tell you this good news. And now you will be silent and not able to speak until the day this happens, because you did not believe my words, which will come true at their proper time.'

Meanwhile, the people were waiting for Zechariah and wondering why he stayed so long in the temple. When he came out, he could not speak to them. They realized he

had seen a vision in the temple, for he kept making signs to them but remained unable to speak.

When his time of service was completed, he returned home. After this his wife Elizabeth became pregnant and for five months remained in seclusion. 'The Lord has done this form me,' she said, `In these days he has shown his favor and taken away my disgrace among the people.'," (Luke 1:5-25 NIV).

DISCUSSION

- What disgrace did Elizabeth experience? (**Hint**: think about the culture!)
- What could John the Baptist be entrusted to Elizabeth and Zechariah?
- What great things would John do for God?
- What disgrace would you like the Lord to remove from your life?

YOUNG CHILDREN DISCUSSION

- Let's Act out what happened to Zechariah
- Did God do what the angel promised?

SING: O Come All Ye Faithful (C.C. pg.2), Joy to the World (C.C. pg.3), Jingle Bells (Wee Sing pg.10).

DECEMBER 17:

"In the sixth month, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. The angel went to her and said, `Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you.'

Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. But the angel said to her. Do not be afraid, Mary, you have found favor with God. You will be with child and give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over the house of Jacob forever; his kingdom will never end.'

'How will this be,' Mary asked the angel, 'since I am a virgin?'

The angel answered, `The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God. Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be barren is in her sixth month. For nothing is impossible with God.'

`I am the Lord's servant,' Mary answered. `May it be to me as you have said.' Then the angel left her," (Luke 1:26-38 NIV)

- Contrast her question to the angel with Zechariah's question to the angel.

- Why does the angel mention that Elizabeth, her relative, is going to have a baby?
- What difficult circumstances might lie ahead for Mary?
- Describe Mary's heart toward God and His will?
- What does it mean for us today that "nothing is impossible with God"?

YOUNG CHILDREN DISCUSSION

- What do you think angels look like?
- Would you be scared if you suddenly saw a big shiny angel?
- What did the angel promise Mary?

DECEMBER 18:



"At that time Mary got ready and hurried to a town in the hill country of Judah, where she entered Zechariah's home and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. In a loud voice she exclaimed: `Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! But why am I so favored, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed is she who has believed that what the Lord has said to her will be accomplished!" (Luke 1:39-45 NIV).

- Why would Mary go visit Elizabeth?
- How would Mary be a blessing to Elizabeth? (Note: Elizabeth was in her sixth month when Gabriel appears, Mary travels and stays about 3 months.)
- How would Elizabeth be a help to Mary? (See Titus 2:3-5)
- Inside Elizabeth's womb, John is already filled with the Holy Spirit. Why does He leap when he hears the sound of Mary's greeting?
- Elizabeth is then filled with the Holy Spirit and prophesies. What does the prophetic word mean?
- Why does Elizabeth call Mary, "the mother of my Lord"?
- What can we see about the role of the Holy Spirit in relationship to Jesus?

• How can we be more filled with the Holy Spirit?

"And Mary said:

`My soul praises the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has been mindful of the humble state of his servant.

From now on all generations will call me blessed, for the Mighty One has done great things for me--holy is his name.

His mercy extends to those who fear him, from generation to generation.

He has performed mighty deeds with his arm; he has scattered those who are proud in their inmost thoughts.

He has brought down rulers from their thrones but has lifted up the humble.

"When it was time for Elizabeth to have her baby, she gave birth to a son. Her neighbors and relatives heard that the Lord had shown her great mercy, and they shared her joy.

On the eighth day they came to circumcise the child, and they were going to name him after his father Zechariah, but his mother spoke up and said, `No! He is to be called John.'

They said to her, `There is no one among your relatives who has that name.'

Then they made signs to his father, to find out what he would like to name the child. He asked for a writing tablet, and to everyone's astonishment he wrote, `His name is John.' Immediately his mouth was opened and his tongue was loosed, and he began to speak, praising God. The neighbors were all filled with awe, and throughout the hill country of Judea people were talking about all these things. DECEMBER 21:



"His father Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and prophesied:

`Praise be to the Lord, the God of Israel, because he has come and has redeemed his people.

He has raised up a horn of salvation for us in the house of his servant David (as he said through his holy prophets of long ago),

salvation from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us--

to show mercy to our fathers and to remember his holy covenant, the oath he swore to our father Abraham:

to rescue us from the hand of our enemies, and to enable us to serve him without fear in holiness and righteousness before him all our days.

And you, my child, will be called a prophet of the Most High; for you will go on before the Lord to prepare the way for him,

to give his people the knowledge of salvation through the forgiveness of their sins,

because of the tender mercy of our God, by which the rising sun will come to us from heaven

to shine on those living in darkness and in the shadow of death,

to guide our feet into the path of peace.'

And the child grew and became strong in spirit; and he lived in the desert until he appeared publicly to Israel" (Luke 1:67-80 NIV).

DISCUSSION

- How can John prepare for his future ministry?
- How can you prepare for your future ministry?

YOUNG CHILDREN DISCUSSION

• Zechariah sang a song for his son, John about all the great things God would do for his country through John. Make up a song or poem about how God will use you to teach people about Jesus.

"This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. Because Joseph her husband was a righteous man and did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, `Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins.'

All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: `The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel'— which means, `God with us.'

When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home to be his wife. But he had no union with her until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus," (Matthew 1:18-25 NIV).

DECEMBER 23:



"In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to his own town to register.

So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in strips of cloth and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn," (Luke 2:1-7 NIV).

DECEMBER 24:



"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning.

Through him all things were made: without him nothing was made that has been made. In him was life, and that life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it.

There came a man who was sent from God; his name was John. He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all men might believe. He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light. The true light that gives light to every man was coming into the world.

He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God—children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God.

The Word became flesh and lived for awhile among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.

John testifies concerning him. He cries out, saying, `This was he of whom I said, "He who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me."'

Open in prayer thanking Jesus and telling Him that we are here to worship Him!!

DECEMBER 26:

DECEMBER 27:

"On the eighth day, when it was time to circumcise him, he was named Jesus, the name the angel had given him before he had been conceived.

When the time of their purification according to the Law of Moses had been completed, Joseph and Mary took him to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord (as it is written in the Law of the Lord, `Every firstborn male is to be consecrated to the Lord), and to offer a sacrifice in keeping with what is said in the Law of the Lord: `a pair of doves or two young pigeons.' {Lev. 12:8}" (Luke 2:21-24 NIV).

DISCUSSION

- The sacrifice made reveals that Mary and Joseph were poor. Why does God entrust His Son to parents who are poor, rather than wealthy?
- What qualities do you see in Mary and Joseph throughout Sripture that are worth imitating?

YOUNG CHILDREN DISCUSSION

• Mary and Joseph dedicated Jesus to the Lord. Look at pictures of when you were dedicated to the Lord. What things do your mommy and daddy do to help you know Jesus?

SING: Joy to the World! (C.C. pg.3), Silent Night (C.C. pg.1), The First Noel (C.C. pg.6).

DECEMBER 28:



"Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Christ. Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying:

`Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you now dismiss your servant in peace. For my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of all people, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel.'

The child's father and mother marveled at what was said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to Mary, his mother: `This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul too,' " (Luke 2:25-35 NIV).

DECEMBER 29:

"There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was very old; she had lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, and then was a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshipped night and day, fasting and praying. Coming up to them at that very moment, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem.

When Joseph and Mary had done everything required by the Law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee to their own town of Nazareth. And the child grew and became strong; he was filled with wisdom and the grace of God was upon him," (Luke 2:36-40 NIV).

DECEMBER 30:



"After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, `Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him.'

When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Christ was to be born. 'In Bethlehem in Judea,' they replied, 'for this is what the prophet has written:

"But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will be the shepherd of my people Israel."

Then Herod called the magi secretly and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, `Go and make a careful search for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him.'

After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen in the east went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold and of incense and of myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route," (Matthew 2:1-12)

- How did God speak to them and thwart Herod's plan?
- How does God speak to you and give you direction?

YOUNG CHILDREN DISCUSSION

- How was Herod acting mean and sneaky?
- How did God take care of Jesus?
- How does God protect you?

SING: We Three Kings of Orient Are (C.C. pg.4), Joy to the World! (C.C. pg.3), Here We Come A Caroling (Wee Sing pg.6).

DECEMBER 31:



"When they had gone, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream. `Get up,' he said, `take the child and his mother and escape to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you, for Herod is going to search for the child to kill him.'

So he got up, took the child and his mother during the night and left for Egypt, where he stayed until the death of Herod. And so was fulfilled what the Lord had said through the prophet: `Out of Egypt I called my son.'

When Herod realized that he had been outwitted by the Magi, he was furious, and he gave orders to kill all the boys in Bethlehem and its vicinity who were two years old and under, in accordance with the time he had learned from the magi. Then what was said through the prophet Jeremiah was fulfilled:

`A voice is heard in Ramah, weeping and great mourning, Rachel weeping for her children and refusing to be comforted, because they are no more.' "

--Matthew 2:13-18

- Why does Joseph leave for Egypt at night?
- What vicious plot does Herod enact?
- How is this similar to Moses' birth? And abortion today?
- God kept Jesus safe. When has God kept you safe from evil plots and circumstances? Thank Him!

YOUNG CHILDREN DISCUSSION

• Jesus traveled to another country with his parents until the bad king was dead. What other country would be fun to live in?

SING: O Holy Night (A.M.C.C. pg.10), Deck the Halls (C.C. pg.14), Angels From the Realms of Glory (C.C.pg.13).

CELEBRATE: Hang out, have fun, play games, laugh, joke! Bring in the New Year with worship and communion.



After Herod died, an angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, `Get up, take the child and his mother and go to the land of Israel, for those who were trying to take the child's life are dead.'

So he got up, took the child and his mother and went to the land of Israel.

But when he heard that Archelaus was reigning in Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. Having been warned in a dream, he withdrew to the district of Galilee, and he went and lived in a town called Nazareth. So was fulfilled what was said through the prophets: `He will be called a Nazarene,' " (Matthew 2:19-23 NIV).

DISCUSSION

- God speaks to Joseph at least 4 times through dreams. What is Joseph's response each time?
- God leads the family to the right place by putting a bad ruler in wrong place. When has God led you through circumstances, negative or positive?

YOUNG CHILDREN DISCUSSION

- Jesus moved again! What is it like to move to another home?
- Do you think Jesus liked traveling and moving?

SING: Good King Wenceslas (A.M.C.C. pg14), Away in the Manger (C.C. pg.12), O Come All Ye Faithful (C.C. pg.2).



"Every year his parents went to Jerusalem for the Feast of the Passover. When he was twelve years old, they went up to the Feast, according to the custom. After the Feast was over, while his parents were returning home, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but they were unaware of it. Thinking he was in their company, they traveled on for a day. Then they began looking for him among their relatives and friends. When they did not find him, they went back to Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple courts, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. Everyone who heard him was amazed at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished. His mother said to him, `Son, why have you treated us like this? Your father and I have been anxiously searching for you.'

`Why were you searching for me?' He asked. `Didn't you know I had to be in my Father's house?' But they did not understand what he was saying to them.

Then he went down to Nazareth with them and was obedient to them. But his mother treasured all these things in her heart. And Jesus grew in wisdom and stature, and in favor with God and men," (Luke 2:41-52 NIV).

DISCUSSION

- Why was Jesus' understanding of the Law so amazing?
- Jesus was already beginning His practice of asking questions. What questions do you think He asked the teachers in the temple?
- Why is discussing the Word of God so valuable?
- What 4 areas did the child, Jesus, grow up in?

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YOUNG CHILDREN DISCUSSION

- What was Jesus talking about to the teachers?
- Why did Jesus know more than they did?
- Jesus went home with His parents and was obedient to them. How can you be obedient to your parents?

SING: Joy to the World! (C.C. pg.3), He's Everything to Me (I.V. pg.12), I am the Light of the World (I.V. pg.15).

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Celebrate! Series

God created us to enjoy Him and celebrate the good things He has done for us! These celebrations are "holy days" or holidays! They are special days set apart to remember God, who He is, and what He has done for us!

Though the world tries to secularize holy days to keep our eyes off of Jesus, we can celebrate with our families in a way that draws us all closer to God! We don't have to walk in the ways of the world, but can transform each and every holiday so that it is pleasing and honoring to God!

How, What, and Why to Celebrate!

God, Himself, instituted holy days and celebrations in the Old Testament to His people as they moved out of slavery into the Promised Land. Here is a list of the celebrations of the Jewish people.

- Shabbat/Sabbath (seventh day of each week—day of rest)
- Purim (Adar—Esther saved her people!)
- Passover/Pesach (Nisan for one day—Passover in Exodus)
- Feast of Unleavened Bread/Hag HaMatzah (Nisan for seven days—eating unleavened bread, like Israelites did on the way to the Promised Land)
- Feast of First Fruits/Yom HaBikkurim (Nisan—offerings)
- Feast of Weeks/Feast of Harvest/Pentecost/Shavucit (Sivan—Thankful for Harvest, offerings)
- Feast of Trumpets/Rosh Hashanah (Tishri—blowing trumpets, offerings)
- Day of Atonement/Yom Kippur (Tishri—fasting, repentance)

Feast of Tabernacles/Feast of Booths/Feast of Ingathering (Tishri seven days—camping!)

The early church began to celebrate its own set of holidays and feast days to remember the birth, life, death, and resurrection of our Beloved Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The church also began to celebrate Christian heroes who had made an impact on other believers with their life and ministry. These are called "saints days." Here is a list of the church year celebrations.

- Advent (December—four weeks before Christmas)
- Christmas (December 25 Birth of Jesus)
- Candlemas (January 2—Presentation of Jesus at the temple)
- Epiphany (January 5—Wise Men)
- Christmastide (Sunday after Epiphany—Jesus' baptism)

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- Ash Wednesday (Beginning of Lent—reminder that we are "ashes to ashes; dust to dust")
- Lent (40 Days before Easter –Christ fasting in the wilderness)
- Holy Week: Palm Sunday (Sunday before Easter—Jesus triumphal procession into Jerusalem)
- Holy Week: Maundy Thursday (Thursday before Easter—foot washing)
- Holy Week: Good Friday (Friday before Easter—Jesus' death on the cross)
- Easter/Resurrection Day (spring date set according to Jewish Passover—Jesus Resurrection from the dead!)
- Pentecost
- All Saints Day (November 1—celebrating the saints!)

We can celebrate holidays, birthdays, and other special occasions with our own family traditions, giving us a unique identity as a family. Family traditions provide happy memories and security for our children, but they also give us an opportunity to instill values in our children's hearts and lives. As we cast aside empty traditions and patterns of the world, we can embrace holy and joyful celebrations of God's goodness to us.
